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# FIRST STEP: RIPPING OUT OLD FLOORING

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In the picture below, I am ripping out our old lamination with a tool called an angled floor scraper.(yes I did it in my PJs)



- To begin, I had to rip out all of our carpets and lamination. Luckily, we had all the supplies already because we redid our floor in our old house.

# SECOND STEP: PICKING OUT OUR NEW FLOORING

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This is a picture of our new carpet for our stairs and the vinyl for the rest of the house.



- Next, my mom and I went to the home depot in Reno and picked out all new flooring. We ran into a few issues during this, which I will explain later.

# STEP 3: MAKING DUMP RUNS

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- Third, I made dump runs with my mom and we took all of our old flooring and boxes of new flooring.



# STEP 4: PUTTING IN ALL NEW FLOORING

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- Lastly, we put in all new flooring and new carpet. Putting in the floor took way less time than tearing it out.

# PROBLEMS I RAN INTO

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The only problem I ran into was our truck can only hold 1 ton and our flooring was 4 tons so we had to run back and forth to Reno 4 times in one day because we had to install the flooring by that weekend. This made the day very long but it was definitely worth it.

# MONEYS SPENT

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- Money spent:
  - -\$7,467 for the new floors
  - -\$528 for baseboards
  - -\$26 for cocking
  - -\$47 on new floor scraper
  - Roughly \$8,068
